<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p><b>1. Place value working model.</b></p> <p>* Prepare a 3D chart that uses recycled materials to practice building numbers.</p> <p>Activity: Glue 5 or 6 small paper cups (or envelopes) horizontally across the chart paper.</p> <p>Label each cup: L, T-Th, Th, H, T, O.</p> <p>Provide a set of "Digit Ice cream Sticks" (ice cream sticks or strips of paper numbered 0–9) for students</p> <p>to "build" specific numbers, such as "A number with 4 in the hundreds place and 7 in the ten-thousands place. 3 in one place.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Or</b></p> <p><b>2. The "Operation Detective" Anchor Chart</b></p> <p>* Solving word problems is often the hardest part of the Operations chapter. This chart acts as a decoding guide for math vocabulary.</p> <p>Task: Divide the chart into four quadrants: Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, and Division and list "Key Words" under each quadrant, that signal which operation to use</p> <p>Examples:</p> <p>Addition (+): Sum, Total, Altogether, In all.</p> <p>Subtraction (-): Difference, How many more, Left, Remain.</p> <p>Multiplication (×): Product, Each, Times, Per.</p> <p>Division (÷): Quotient, Share equally, Split, Distributed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Write a word problem for each operation: [not more than 4 lines] Addition, subtraction, multiplication, division.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Science</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Draw any one plant (cactus/lotus/coconut tree/pine tree). Label its leaves, stem and roots and write where does the plant grow? How does the Plant survive?</li> </ul>
<p><b>Social Science</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Weather wheel (Moving Chart): Make a rotating wheel showing sunny rainy, cloudy windy. Use a split pin to rotate. Write when each weather happens. Record one week weather report.</li> </ul>
